This year has offered an exciting opportunity for LASE faculty and staff to collaborate, reflect, and evaluate the impact of our ministry within the Lutheran

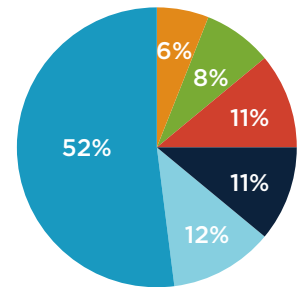

FISCAL YEAR AUGUST 1, 2015 TO JULY 31, 2016

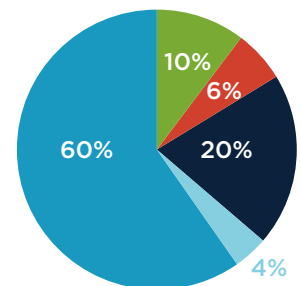
