CHRIST COMMUNITY LUTHERAN SCHOOL EARLY EDUCATION PROGRAM

“Bring us the children who need You, God” was the prayer of **Angela Shirley, Executive Director of the CCLS Early Childhood Education Program**. Angela and her faculty at four campuses impressively serve as strong Christian leaders for their students, parents and peers.

Today, many early childhood professionals are seeing an increase in the number of young children with a variety of special needs and challenges in their classrooms. These teachers often rely on outside resources to gain additional

knowledge and to learn strategies to better support these young children. Angela (wanting to be proactive), was connected with LASE Specialized Education Consultants, Tara Copeland and Mary Skittino to collaborate and better serve the needs of CCLS’s current early childhood students. The LASE educators serve as a resource for the faculty by observing students, modeling new approaches in the classroom to meet a variety of needs at different levels, and sharing their expertise at IEP and parent/teacher meetings. **LASE Educational Consultants work with children to advocate for their needs** while also working collaboratively with CCLS faculty to model strategies they can implement in the classroom. This positive focus sets the tone for the whole classroom while letting all the students see what behaviors are expected. The CCLS and LASE collaborative team are helping these young children regulate their emotions and

verbalize their needs to enhance their learning and to let their little lights shine.

The hope is to better equip and empower these educators so they can effectively impact children to realize their God-given potential.

LASE is excited to kick-off this new initiative in early August 2020, with a professional development workshop, led by Lori Benson Adams—a nationally known educational intervention specialist.
